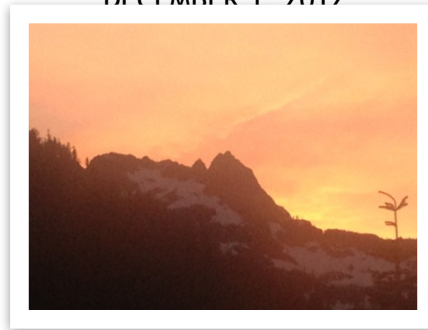


ALPENTAL COMMUNITY CLUB

  - Elections
